SECTION 'A' VEGETABLES

1. Five Potatoes
2. Six Runner Beans
3. Three Onions - *shown as grown*
4. Five Shallots - *maximum 30 mm diameter*
5. Three Beetroot - *shown as grown*
6. Three Carrots - *shown as grown*
7. Three Courgettes
8. Longest Runner Bean
9. Three chillies
10. Four tomatoes (not cherry tomatoes)
11. A truss of 'cherry' tomatoes
12. A bunch of mixed culinary herbs - *tied and in water- list of herbs displayed to be provided*
13. Gardener's choice - a basket containing 3 different types of vegetable
14. Heaviest Vegetable - *not pumpkin or marrow families*
15. Most amusing vegetable

SECTION 'B' FRUIT (*all should have stalks*)

16. Eight plums or damsons - *may be mixed varieties*
17. Soft fruit - 10 currants or berries - *may be mixed varieties - maximum of 6 of each*
18. Three Dessert Apples
19. Three Dessert Pears
20. Three Cooking Apples

SECTION 'C' FLOWERS

21. Three single roses - *mixed or single variety*
22. Three Dahlias - *mixed or single variety*
23. Vase of Mixed flowers
24. Six Annuals or Perennials of any one variety, not on schedule
25. Foliage pot plant
26. Flower arrangement - *max 750 mm (30") wide - 'Rainbow'*

SECTION 'C+' VISITOR JUDGED ENTRY

27. 'The Harvest'- An arrangement of berries, fruits, stems and leaves - *750 mm (30") width allowed*

SECTION 'D' COOKERY AND HOMECRAFTS

28. Jar of Strawberry Jam
29. Jar of Lemon Curd
30. Jar of Fruit Jelly
31. Jar of Chutney - *3 - 12 months old, date of making to be shown*
32. Bottle of Fruit Liqueur - *up to 12 months old, date of making and main ingredients to be shown*

33. Swiss Roll
34. Three Cheese Scones
35. Round of Shortbread, marked into 8 sections, not cut - *any recipe*

SECTION 'D+' DADS & LADS

36. A 'Lattice' apple tart.

SECTION 'E' HANDICRAFTS AND ART

37. An item of Knitting
38. An item of Embroidery - *not counted cross stitch*
39. An item of Embroidery - *counted cross stitch or tapestry*
40. A painting - *watercolour*
41. A painting - *any medium except watercolour*
42. A drawing in pencil or ink
43. Any other item of handicraft - *to be accompanied by a written description / explanation - maximum 10 lines on A5 paper*

SECTION 'E+' PHOTOGRAPHY

All to be max 20 cm X 20 cm mounted on card max 30 cm X 30 cm - not framed - all to be judged on their 'appeal' to the judges.

44. A sea shell and / or sea creature
45. A photo of a group of people (maximum 20 people)
46. A digitally modified photo - *to be accompanied by an unmodified version of the photo and a brief written description of the technique used.*

SECTION 'F1' CHILDREN 2 - 6+ years

47. A self portrait
48. An 'edible' picture - *maximum size 200 mm X 250 mm.*
49. A painting of a farm scene
50. Any other handicraft.

SECTION 'F2' CHILDREN 7 - 11+ years

51. A miniature garden
52. A painting of a farm scene
53. Four lines of 'decorated' handwriting
54. Four 'butterfly' cakes
55. Any other handicraft (*to be accompanied by a written description / explanation - maximum 10 lines on A5 paper*)

SECTION 'F3' CHILDREN 12 - 16 years

56. A decorated watering can
57. A Swiss roll
58. A painting of a farm scene
59. A picture made from seeds, petals and leaves
60. Any other handicraft (*to be accompanied by a written description / explanation - maximum 10 lines on A5 paper*)

Of course all entries must be home grown/produced/made and not previously exhibited! Children's entries must - of course - be produced by the children.
